Easter Worship



Dear Church,

When was the last time you picked up a Bible and gave it a good read? The question is not at all meant to be a judgment—just a pondering. For my part, I used to have a black, leather-bound Bible from which I would read, and the dust that could gather on that black cover would accumulate quickly. When you read the Bible, what are you looking for? Comfort? Knowledge or wisdom? A good story? A guide for life? I would guess that, as Lutherans, without even knowing it, you are reading the Bible with an eye toward Jesus and the justification before God and the forgiveness of sins he

brings for you. This is our Lutheran tradition's understanding of the Scripture—that we interpret everything through the lens that is Jesus Christ. He is, after all, as St. John's Gospel reminds us: the Word made flesh. Whatever preaches Christ, Martin Luther says, that is our interpretation of God's Word.

Thus, the Bible is much more than a rulebook or a guide for living or a source of wisdom or even comfort. The Bible is God's ever-living address, God's own words to you, borne in the Body of the Word made flesh, Christ Jesus.

As Lent continues and as Easter approaches, you are invited into the great living address of the Passion, the Way of the Cross, and to ponder anew the meaning of Jesus's crucifixion, death, burial, and resurrection. All this is God's living address to you, showing you how much God loves you and all the world. With Jesus as our only means of viewing Scripture, our only lens, we are blessed to see again the promises God has made in Christ. And in those promises, in that justification, in that forgiveness, in your eternal life, there is then Jesus's interpretation of all the world as a place and as a whole people to love—neighbors, friends, strangers, even enemies. All are included in God's promises. All are included in God's living address through the Word.

If you're still looking for a spiritual practice to pick up in Lent, try just meandering through the texts of the Gospels, of St. Paul's letters, of Isaiah or the Psalms. Here, you are most certainly addressed by the Word of God! God loves you and has given God's very self for you! This is a great way to read one's Bible and to again be assured of your secured future.


