Dear Church,

An old coach of mine once said: "Ninety percent of life is just showing up." And how you show up, Church!

If you have been receiving this newsletter for a while, then you know what kind of place North Branch is. It is a place where gratitude is overflowing, where service to neighbor is unending, where the promises of God are reflected in every word, gesture, act, and encounter. It is a place where all one needs to do is ask and the answer comes flowing back in love and compassion, in prayer or praise, sympathy or empathy, or even in sweat and money. This past month has shown us all what God has wrought

in this place, just by showing up.

Faced with two large funerals—for Brad Berner on Oct. 20 and for Verneel Noerrlinger on Oct. 21—so many people stepped to the front to help the families in a time of great grief. Visitors to our church at both funerals were moved by the overwhelming display of this compassion—wondering where all this food and service came from. All I could say was the truth about who you are: "That's the Body of Christ in motion in this place, just showing up."

At this moment, we have a funeral survey out gauging the talent and time of the congregation and already, we are seeing exactly what we expected: just about everybody at North Branch is able and interested in helping to serve or make food for funeral luncheons or assist in funeral worship.

In last month's newsletter, when we broke the news of a budget shortfall, so many of you—and many of you, anonymously!—delved deeper into your giving and we are making headway on meeting that deficit.

For nearly 150 years now, that's how this congregation has been meeting and serving its neighbors, here in the congregation and in the wider community. This is a place where people are truly excited to serve, to see their siblings in Christ on Sunday morning and throughout the week, to engage with the wider world as the Body of Christ.

There is—as there always has been—something special going on here at North Branch. The movement of the Holy Spirit to animate this Body of Christ continues to blow like the everpresent wind here on this hill. And we want you—all of you reading this newsletter—to be a part of it. I encountered several people this week who approached me with downcast eyes and frowns who said it had been some time since they'd last been in church. My answer is always the same, the answer I'm sure all of you would also give: you are always welcome here without shame, without reservation, without judgment. Just come. Just show up.

If you're reading this newsletter and it's been "a hot minute" since you were last here at church, we all want you to know that whenever and however you come through the doors here, you will be received with nothing but joy and excitement. If you haven't been to a Bible study in some time, you can drop into any one of the studies we have going on, anytime, and we'll be so delighted to have you. Just come. Just show up.

Just show up. You might be surprised by what more comes.


bread when the ushers bring forth the offering. Thank you for your willingness to help us with our worship service.

At the Nebraska Synod Assembly, a year-long focus was launched to "Go And..." Be part of this call to GO. During the Synod Assembly, they taught how to lean

in as God's people called, gathered, and sent to "Go And..." The Synod created a year of intentional themes around this focus.

November's is Go And...Be Honest. Engage in honest conversations with those around you. When we are honest with others and honest with ourselves we can have deeper connection in our relationships with others and with God.

# GO AND...

Honesty requires vulnerability, awareness, and a willingness to really listen. Assumptions and half-truths can lead us to misunderstand the situation and story. What does reconciliation mean as we strive to move from places of misunderstanding? God calls us to be honest. Sometimes, that may look like lament and confession, and other times hymns of praise and gratitude.

#### Questions to Consider:

- · What is a time you didn't tell the whole truth... or were not honest?
- · What piece of history should you/could you explore with a lens of honesty?
- · In what way are you being dishonest in your life?
- GO and express gratitude by saying thank you to someone who deserves it.

**Prayer:** Reconciling God, we ask for forgiveness for the times we have not reconciled our differences and acknowledged the hurts and wounds we have caused. Amen.
