Sunday Brunch



Fair Stand Pie Updates

To The Congregation:

Thank you for supporting me as a Fair Stand Committee Member.

I was mainly the "overseer" for Pies, Yumburgers & Brownies.

Thank you to the ladies of our church for all the assistance they did and advice in planning for the pies and brownies before and during the fair. I am still calculating the final number of pies we had for the entire fair, but as of today I believe we served 155 pies (930) slices and had 11 pies we didn't serve during the fair. If I asked you for EXTRA pies during the fair (and you did not fill out a form for pies BEFORE the fair) please contact me so I can verify my notes.

From these figures I now have a better idea for next year in planning for the number and flavor of the pies (as well as brownies). From what I learned onsite as well as advice given to me from you and others, we should have a smoother operation next year.

Thank you also to Leonard & Letha, Don & Carrie, as well as Kirby in preparing the original 5 batches of Yumburgers. Ingredients were NOT changed, but with what I learned and the advice of Letha & Carrie, the PREPA-RATION of the yumburgers has been updated and documented for the future. A special thanks to Kirby, JoDee, Don & Carrie for their help early Saturday morning in preparing another 3 batches of yumburgers—I could not have done it without you!

I also have so many other individuals to thank, members and non-members, but I will not try to list them all since I don't want to leave anyone out...just know that I am grateful for whatever support you gave me and the rest of the Committee.

And finally, to the other Committee members, Alan (Chairman), Pastor Adam, Diane, Cathy & Dennis—each one of you contributed your skills, talents and TIME that ultimately made this a success. Of course, there were things that were negative with our first year of this adventure, but the positive in the end outweighed any issues that we confronted.

First Lutheran Church Youth Pies

These are the pies that the youth members helped to bake along with some generous volunteers!

(Reminder: Convection Bake (as with our new parish hall ovens) is DIFFERENT then a true convection oven. Convection Bake circulates heat better and is very good for pies, etc. but does not shorten the baking time...use same baking time as you would with bake...thank you to JoDee's mother LuAnn Ruwe for confirming this for me when we were baking the youth pies...)

Easy Cherry Pie

- 1 unbaked 9" Pie Crust (in pie tin-prefer Pillsbury)
- 2 (21 oz.) cans of cherry pie filling (4 c.)
- 1 (14.5 oz.) can of red tart cherries (drained)
- 1 t. vanilla or almond extract (your preference)
- 1 T. instant tapioca
- 2 t. lemon juice
- OPTIONAL: 2 T. Cherry Jam or Jelly

Mix ingredients and place in pie tin.

If using a crust topping, dot 2 T. of unsalted butter on filling BEFORE placing top crust over pie. Not needed if you use crumb topping (see end of pie recipes for crumb topping).

Bake 375 degrees in center of oven, 45-60 minutes until it bubbles around edge. After 20 minutes of baking time, you might want to cover crust edge with strips of foil or a metal pie crust edge cover.

Reminder: A true convection oven may be lowered to 350 degrees and MIGHT take only 30 minutes.

Easy Peach Pie

Same as above except for following: Use Peach pie filling instead of cherry Use 1 can of drained sliced peaches instead of cherries Add ½ t. cinnamon OPTIONAL: 2 T. Peach Jam or Jelly instead of Cherry

Easy Strawberry Pie

Same as Cherry Pie except for following Use Strawberry pie filling instead of cherry Use 1 c. of sliced strawberries instead of cherries Optional: 2 T. of Strawberry jam or jelly AND 1 t. orange extract

Crumb Topping

⅓ c. softened butter
¾ c. brown sugar
½ c. flour
⅓ c. sugar
Mix butter, brown sugar, and flour. Sprinkle on top of filling.

Personal Care Kits

"When LWR distributes Personal Care Kits, it's often to people who have lost everything. In the wake of an earthquake or having fled from violence as their homes were overtaken, they clasp a towel from a faraway place, with a bar of soap, a toothbrush...and washing up, they know that they have not been forsaken by the world. The simple gesture of giving a Personal Care Kit can give someone the encouragement to start anew, starting with a bath!" What to include:

- 1 light-weight bath-size towel (between 20" x 40" and 52" x 27"), dark color
- 2 bath-size bars of soap
- 1 adult-size toothbrush
- 1 sturdy comb (remove packaging)
- 1 metal nail clippers

School Kits

"Why school supplies? To the children who receive School Kits, these supplies mean the difference between getting an education or not. Public school is usually free, but in the places where LWR woks, even a few required supplies, like pens and paper, may be more than many families can afford. And when parents can only afford to send one of their children to school, girls rarely get priority...yet the education level of mothers has the biggest impact on development." What to include:

- 4 70-sheet notebooks (8" x 10 ½") No loose-leaf paper
- 1 30-centimeter ruler, or a ruler with centimeters on one side and inches on the other
- 1 pencil sharpener
- 1 pair of blunt scissors
- 5 unsharpened #2 pencils with erasers
- 5 black or blue ballpoint pens (no gel ink)
- 1 box of 16 or 24 crayons
- 1 2 ½" eraser
